- KinderReaders Tips for Use -

FIVE BOOKS IN ONE: Each level of the book will contain the same illustrations. As the number of the level goes lower, from 4 to 1, the sentence structure, punctuation, and words get easier. You may choose one version for your entire class, use different versions with different groups of children, or combine pages from different versions to create a new version.

Great for Home Use: At home, you can choose the level that best fits your child. You can work with lower levels to practice fluency or move into higher levels to learn new words and skills. (Fluency is reading accurately and with a natural pace and expression.) One advantage of KinderReaders is that you are sure to have a level that will work for your child and you have room to grow.

How to Use the Wordless Version: One suggestion is that the teacher or parent can add text that is appropriate for skills being taught. A second suggestion is to use it as a writing activity for the children and have children add the text. This gives you even more room for differentiation according to your child's level. Another option is to use the wordless version to do a picture walk or retelling.

★ If you are a member of KinderReaders Plus, you'll be able to add text to the wordless version and print out your own custom title!

Printing Books: The pages are formatted so that each page will produce 2 books. Because this is a very large file you may want to print each version individually as needed. If you're only wanting to print one book per page (such as for home use), it is suggested to print the interactive version (see options at KinderReaders.com), which is formatted with only one book per page.

Photocopy all the pages in order (collated), add a staple to the top corner and another mid-page, below the dotted line. Cut on the dotted line. You now have 2 ready to use books.

Remember, each copy will yield 2 books. To calculate the total number of copies needed for each version, take the number of students or books desired and divide it in half. For example, if you need 20 books, you'll want to make 10 copies.
